Resume Building Tips!

- 1. Use lists instead of sentences -When writing about your skills or responsibilities in past work positions, avoid writing in paragraph form and use bullet points instead. This makes your resume easier to read, which employers appreciate!
- 2. Use "no space" formatting At the top of your word document there are options for formatting. Clicking the "no space" option allows you to fit more items on your resume by getting rid of unwanted blank space.
- 3. The little things matter! Don't forget to include things like sports teams, community groups, and volunteer work on your resume. Volunteering can be anything from assisting a teacher with something extra beyond class time or contributing to an event in the community.
- 4. Have someone proof read it There are some grammar mistakes that even spell-check won't catch. Make sure you are using the right "their" or "your" and have a parent or teacher look it over to catch something you may have missed.
- Use capital letters for proper nouns such as job titles and agency names - ex. Line Cook at Burger King

- View diploma exam marks
- Register to write or rewrite diploma exams with online payment
- View and print Detailed Academic Reports (DAR)

- Order additional copies of an awarded credential in English or French
- Receive notifications for important messages

Apply for scholarships \square

Make sure your transcripts have been sent by checking your Transcript Verification Report. See your school counsellor for details. Continue to search and apply for <u>scholarships</u> and other possible sources of financial aid.

Complete Post Secondary Application □

- Make a master copy of all of your information then you can copy and paste sections into scholarships instead of retyping everything all
 the time
- Type in a word document first to spell check and edit
- Save and save often
- Have someone read it over before submission
- Fill in all required information
- Use **N/A** if sections do not apply
- Do not repeat yourself when answering questions
- Answer questions clearly and concisely
- Check deadlines carefully
- There is a difference between postmarked and received by when sending applications in via mail
