You've probably heard and read a lot about the growth mindset, arguably the most popular psychological theory in education today. The growth mindset is the concept established by Dr. Carol Dweck that your intelligence and talents can be developed through hard work and effort rather than being set in stone (i.e., fixed mindset). Through studies on child behaviour, researchers have determined several benefits to a growth mindset:

1) Students with a growth mindset tend to choose challenging tasks that can help them learn new things

 Students with a growth mindset are more persistent when working through difficult tasks than students with a fixed mindset

3) Students with a growth mindset also generally cope well with transition, exhibit the ability to self-regulate, and have higher self-esteem.

Studies have shown that we can change a person's mindset from fixed to growth. This transition can be facilitated in the classroom through the type of work and feedback we give our students.

- 1. Reviewing the S.M.A.R.T. Goal Setting guide within myBlueprint
- 2. Creating S.M.A.R.T. Goals related to your academics, crosscurricular activities, competencies, and pathway plans
- 3. Adding new skills, hobbies, and certifications to your resumes and adding them to their portfolio to reflect on what you did to achieve/accomplish them
- Creating a portfolio of things that you would like to accomplish someday, and reflecting on what you are doing to now to begin building the required skills
- 5. Adding personal artifacts, videos, pictures, and audio recordings to your Portfolios as you grow and accomplish new things



Planning for Post-Secondary - Grade 12 Checklist

- Make sure the courses you are taking right now meet the admission requirements for the post-secondary program and school you would like to attend. Admission requirements are available online, or for more information on other post-secondary schools, ask your guidance counsellor or visit the post-secondary school's website.
- Apply for a <u>Social Insurance Number</u> (SIN) if you don't already have one.
- Create your own checklist of deadlines for:
 - Admissions applications (These will vary with each post-secondary school.)
 - Financial aid applications
 - o Tuition
 - Housing
 - Materials you will need to submit.

Tip: Keep all this information in a folder and record important dates in your calendar.

• Find out where and who to send your <u>high school</u> <u>transcripts</u> to.

TIP: Not sure where to start? Check out the post-secondary school's website or contact them directly.

 Start researching <u>scholarships and bursaries</u>. Bookmark anything that interests you online or print paper copies of post-secondary student funding programs and scholarships.

TIP: Get a head-start and begin to fill out applications now... send them in before the deadline to be safe.

• Update your <u>portfolio</u> to showcase all your accomplishments in school, volunteer work, jobs, hobbies, sports or other extra-curricular experiences.

You Should Know...

- Your Grade 12 marks, especially from the first semester, count heavily in post-secondary admissions.
- Some post-secondary schools have application deadlines as early as November 1. Check application deadlines for the post-secondary schools that interest you. Also, find out if there are early deadlines to qualify for certain programs, attend different campuses, or to apply for student housing.

Early Application to Competitive Programs - Oct 1

If you are applying to a competitive program it is recommended you get your application in as soon as possible using your final Grade 11 marks. The earlier you apply, the earlier your application can be processed, which increases your chances of receiving an offer at the earliest possible date.

Loran Scholarship - Up to \$100,000

School Sponsored Deadline Oct 17, 2018

Character, service and leadership are the selection criteria for the Loran Scholar program. Loran Scholars are people of strong moral character who have demonstrated commitment to service and potential as leaders

The Loran Scholar program is open to every graduating high school student from coast- to-coast-to-coast. Renewable for up to four years, and valued at up to \$100,000, it includes an annual tuition waiver and a stipend of \$9,000, access to funding and internships through our summer program, invitations to annual gatherings and forums, and one-on-one mentorship. To be eligible, applicants must have earned a minimum cumulative average of 85% in the previous three academic years and be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident.

Application Tips

- Make a master copy of all of your information then you can copy and paste sections into scholarships instead of retyping everything all the time
- Type in a word document first to spell check and edit
- Save and save often
- Have someone read it over before submission
- Fill in all required information
- Use N/A if sections do not apply
- Do not repeat yourself when answering questions
- Answer questions clearly and concisely
- Check deadlines carefully
- There is a difference between postmarked and received by when sending applications in via mail

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
