- In past years there several parent coaches and volunteers so there was a disconnect between academics and extra curricular. This form helped to bridge that gap in understanding and communication.

HIGHLIGHTS:

- Growth in student population has led to hiring of new, energetic teaching staff.

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- Growth has also led to new course offerings, Sport Medicine, Recreational Games, Math 15
- Students with exceptional needs continue to be included in a variety of mainstream and option courses wherever appropriate.
- Continuing to build capacity amongst teachers to create learning environment suitable for ESL students.
- First school in Lethbridge to establish an Esport Team.

Division Priorities are set in the areas of: Achievement, Inclusion, Innovation,

- Goals, study/resources, strategies and measures have been set in areas that are needing addressed.
- The 2021/22 Assurance Plan will be posted on the LCI website soon.

Co-curricular & Extra-curricular Activities – Gordon

- We are discussing audience possibilities for December Fine Art concerts.
- This past weekend we were able to run a volleyball tournament with two adult spectators per athlete watching the games.
- Football games have been allowing spectators under the exemption program.
- We are trying to work with all the restrictions/exemption, streaming as many of the events as we can, and working to get as many parents as possible in to watch the games and performances.
- November 29th Highschool Principals will meet to review things.

Parent Question: If one student comes with one parent (both vaccinated) would it be workable for the student to come?

Answer: We are advocating for the change to “two people” rather than only two adults. Registration exemption program would be required.
