- d. **Board Trustee** Genny Steed From the Board:
 - Doing Community Conversation are being held to find ways to connect with the people of the division. Encouraging parents, teachers, students to attend. Hosting once a month at different venues, days and times. Last month we had our first one and it was successful with Board members, teachers, and parents in attendance. Next one will be Thursday, March 17th from 6-8pm at Boys and Girls Club Youth Centre. The Community Conversations are informal time of discussion without an agenda.
 - It is legislation to have a student at School Council meetings. How do we get them interested though?
 - Board Retreat: Planning meeting to take Town Hall discussion notes and look for common threads with suggestions and

summarize things then work on planning for next year incorporating feedback that was received. Some themes that surfaced that support was being felt in some areas and in some other areas additional support is needed. Staff: Concern for ability to reach all students where they are at. Parents: Desire for support for their students and communication. Students: We received a lot of positive comments.

What are we doing well and what are we needing to be doing? Inclusion came out as something we are doing well but need to continue making this a priority. A theme of wellness also surfaced.
