b. School Council Chair

- i. Follow up Academic Awards Ceremony Middle of October similar format to last year. Discussion: Communication with parents?
 - Last year there were some challenges but issues have been addressed so marks will be collected by end of June.
 - Date could be in December to catch more students or in October around Thanksgiving break.
 - Sponsorship has decreased. Is \$15 worth it or medal?
- ii. Overlapping gym classes: Concerns for safety with some of the classes as there are multiple classes sharing the gym.
 - Using the outdoors as much as possible in spring. Challenges with students not coming prepared with water and sunscreen
 - Choice unit to play indoor soccer or outdoor walk etc.
 - With 400+ more grade 9 students coming the PE department will be meeting to determine fall plan.
 - Management of gym needs to be discussed with teacher or administration as per Alberta School Council Guide
- iii. Gym teachers on phones in class need to be discussed with teacher or administration
 - Teachers do need to use phone when outside to be in touch with admin, lock downs, etc.
 - Teachers use phone for attendance and correcting attendance
 - Playing music on phones
- iv. Follow up on Registration process- Fall
 - Plan is to do registration changes through Teams. We will still have a gr 12 registration day first then a gr 11 registration day then a gr 10 registration day.
 - One of the biggest complains is that with the number of students we have ½ a day is not long enough.
 - On the grade 12 day there will be 6 admin doing registration. Students will be split by alphabet and know who to contact on Teams. Schedule will be posted onto PowerSchool on August 29.
 - With more students coming there will be more options being offered. (Welding, Environmental Science, Fitness, etc.)
 - Master schedule will be on the school website a week before registration so parents can sit down with kids to determine what their ideal schedule is and message on Teams if needed.

- Students will still come August 30 and 31 for photos etc.

- Parent learning session was about the registered apprenticeship program. Andrew Krul who works with the School Division is overseeing the program. It is a shared program between Lethbridge College and LCI (automotive, baking, etc). Duel credit options are listed on the LCI website.
