- Basketball is starting Coaches are all teachers in the school.

  Basketball teams are made. Any students playing vball or football are finishing these seasons first
- ii. Upcoming play "Peter Pan" Dec 4 9 (75% sold out!)
  - SchoolCASHonline Tickets still available!
  - LCI students have opportunity to see the production for FREE (need to sign up for these and is first come first serve).
  - District wide invitation to any school.
  - Production in the Black Box "drama room" (is fully accessible through the back door!)
  - PARENT QUESTION: What would it take to improve the drama and fine arts program here at LCI?
  - ADMIN: We are still trying to recover from COVID shutting down much of the programs (band, choir, drama productions, etc)

- ADMIN: LCI does have high profile programs who have gone to provincial competitions and won, have a phenomenal dance program, etc.
- QUESTION: YATES/STERNDALE BENNETT Could this be used instead of the drama room at LCI?
- ADMIN daytime hours are free but after 4pm the schools are charged for use without a discount.

ASIDE: A bunch of lights have been added outside along the back side of the school to increase safety; especially at night.

- iii. Education Liaison of Alberta Association (ELAA) November 6:30-8:00
- hosted event at LCI (hoping it to be the 1<sup>st</sup> of an annual event!)
- 27 Colleges and Universities and Trade Schools as well as Military and RCMP)
- November: Prime time for early admissions (20 schools came to showcase)
- Estimating about 120 students came during the evening.
- There were a wide variety of post-secondary schools represented that would appeal to EVERY student!
- Ideas for next year:
  - invite other Businesses to also come who are recruiting students (LPS/Fire/EMS/CPRail/Others?)
  - Have an ADVISOR arm the students with questions to ask when they go to the tables. Hoping for even more engagement.
  - Have students print out grades/transcripts via MYPASS ACCOUNT
  - Students should have been introduced to this and MYBLUEPRINT in Health class in Grade 8 and 9. At the end of grade 9, MYPASS is introduced.
  - Students/parents can create a MYPASS account using their ASN (Alberta Student number). A PIN is sent via mail in order to access.
  - Kids use MYPASS in CALM20 as well
  - NOTE: GPAs generated by PowerSchool are NOT accurate due to CTS credits not having a "header" course.
    - MYPASS will show an accurate GPA!
- "CAREER TRANSITIONS" currently hosting webinars to help young students discover different trades (are a private entity)
- Chamber of Commerce is looking for a Career Fair to connect with students so that they can promote Lethbridge as a city to build a life in, and advocate for kids to come back to Lethbridge by having jobs waiting for them.

  - Core Courses: Academic Awards (some are tied at 100%!!!)
  - v. New Admin support (Office and Learning Commons)
  - Starting December 4: Kendra Demartini
  - David Fuller (current LST) works with Victoria
- vi. Exam Schedule for January will be posted Monday, December 4
  - Scheduling tied to Diplomas and PATs (students return January 8 and diplomas begin January 10, 2024).
  - Full classes until Thursday, January 18
  - Exams begin January 19
    - PLEASE: Families block this time off in order for your student to write midterms and diplomas
    - Students are required to stay for a minimum of 1 hour. Students have up to DOUBLE the allotted time (up to 6 hours in a Diploma)
  - BUSSES will run on a REGULAR MORNING schedule only
    - NO AFTERNOON bus
  - Students not taking the bus CAN arrive at school in time for their exam (do not need to be here early)
  - QUESTION: How do you navigate technology during exams?
    - NO: Backpacks, cell phones, watches, earbuds, etc.
    - If 'caught', the student is awarded a ZERO in their exam.

- i. Instagram/ Facebook QR Codes School Council account– Claudia Limon
  - FB created. Instagram has not been up yet.
  - Once organized, it can be posted on the website so parents can sign up.
- ii. Follow up Honor Roll letters
  - QUESTION: Were these sent out?
    - ADMIN: No. The secretary was off and this did not get done.
  - QUESTION: Could letters and certificate be printed off and given to advisors or emailed to graduated students?
    - ADMIN: There is no funding to mail these
  - Students are invited to join the National Honors Society based on academic success (and then recognized as being part of NHS at grad).
    - QUESTION: If a student qualifies or is on the honor roll, but doesn't have time to attend NHS meetings, can these students be recognized as graduating with Honors during the grad ceremony?

NHS – based on academics, volunteer hours and ....

Honor Roll – 80% and above (ANY 4 or more classes are eligible). Valedictorian – Elaine Jacklyn (teacher) does an excellent job of this component – is based on core classes (-1 classes?)

- QUESTION: How many students make Honor Roll?
   ADMIN: About 80 students/grade level

  - Needing Volunteers to help
  - QUESTION: Can parents donate without losing the 4% transaction fee?
    - CHAIR: Was hoping to set this up directly through the DISTRICT to avoid the extra fees. Hoping in the future to have a SOCIETY that can accept E-transfers.
  - IDEA use Sign Up Genius: EASY to have people sign up to bring items, to request volunteers, and then it sends an email out for reminders.
