Canadian Armed Forces Information Table

April 15 11:30-12:30

A member of the Canadian Armed Forces is providing information about part time and full-time summer work opportunities for current high school students.



About the Reserves

The Reserves are the part-time component of the Canadian Armed Forces (CAF). Reserve members take on a voluntary commitment to work with their reserve unit throughout the year. They often work alongside the Regular Force and can be activated in a time of national emergency or crisis.

The nature of the reserves is such that you will work on a part-time basis Wednesday night's 1900-2200 and 1 weekend a month for part of the year (Sep-May). During the summer months, you are normally expected to train full time (May-Aug).

This opportunity is great for:

- Students (high school, college, university); and
 - Individuals with a full-time career, but who would like to serve in the CAF on a part-time basis.
- (Often these individuals take holidays or arrange for leave of absences so they can train full time during the summer).

Eligibility Criteria

The basic eligibility criteria to apply to the CAF are:

Age: 16 or older for the Reserves

(anyone under 18 will require parental consent)

Citizenship: Must have Canadian Citizenship or Permanent Resident Status

Education: Minimum grade 10 complete at time of enrolment (some occupations require additional education)

How to Join

Applicants start by applying at www.forces.gc.ca. Once an applicant has submitted an application online, they will need to contact 41CBG.Recruiting.Leth@forces.gc.ca. All applicants will then need to submit the following original/official documents: Government Issued Photo ID, Birth Certificate or Proof of Citizenship or Permanent Resident Card, and Educational Transcripts (high school or university or an international accreditation).

Application Process

Processing will be completed at Vimy Ridge Armoury 337 Stubb Ross Road for all Lethbridge applicants. Once applicants have submitted all the required documents to a recruiter, they will be scheduled in for their Force test (physical fitness test). Following successful completion of the Force test, applicants will be scheduled for their medical examination and an interview. Throughout the application process we will be conducting a background check. Once an applicant has passed their Force test, medical examination, interview, and the background check they will be merited for selection to the unit of their choice. Once selected applicants will be enrolled into the Canadian Armed Forces.

Pay and Benefits

Starting Salary for an **Officer Cadet** is \$133.16 per day.

Starting Salary for a **Private Recruit** is \$127.22 per day.

There are regular pay increases each year of service and upon promotion. You may receive additional financial allowances when you are training – field pay, temporary duty, etc.

Travel and transportation expenses related to training and courses are covered. Accommodations and meals are provided while on course.

Members receive **dental coverage** (including plans for family) and **medical coverage** when training/employed.

Possible university or college education tuition reimbursement up to **\$2000 per academic year four times in your military career**. Scholarships and bursaries are also available depending on your academic institution and amount of military service completed.

Applicants who join the reserves will be entitled to **Full Time Summer Employment**. Full time summer employment starts in May and ends at the end of August. Start dates are flexible based off the member's availability.

Initial Engagement

Reservists make a voluntary (paid) commitment to serve in the Canadian Armed Forces and are expected to work on a part-time basis. In Alberta, reservists work **one evening per week from 1900-2200** and one weekend a month. Reservists will be expected to start working once they enroll and before they attend their Basic Military Qualification course.

Training

Every member of the Canadian Armed Forces Reserve must complete a Reserve Basic Military Qualification course (BMQ) – 30 training days. After completion of BMQ, members will then be required to complete related environmental and occupation training. Part time options for completing BMQ will be available from Sept-April and full time from May to August, however, occupational courses will only be offered on a full-time basis.

WHAT DOES IT TAKE TO BE SUCCESSFUL IN SUMMER SCHOOL?

If you are motivated, organized, and can follow a timeline, Summer School just might be for you.

Remember, you have only 4 weeks, June 30 to July 24, to complete your course.

Attendance is crucial for success in Summer School. Please book off work during the day from 8:00 to 3:00.



MISSING ONE CLASS IS EQUIVALENT TO MISSING ALMOST EIGHT DAYS OF A SEMESTERIZED COURSE.

DIPLOMA COURSE HOURS

- YOU ARE REQUIRED TO BE AVAILABLE FROM 8:00 - 3:00PM EACH DAY.
- THE TEACHER WILL DETERMINE CLASS, EXAM AND TUTORIAL TIME DURING THOSE HOURS.

WHEN IS SUMMER SCHOOL?

Registrations will be accepted between May 1 and June 27, 2025. Classes begin Monday, June 30, and end Thursday, July 24. Classes run Monday to Thursday each week.

***Please note that classes will run on Tuesday July 1st.**

DIPLOMA COURSES ARE IN-PERSON WITH STRICT ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENTS DURING THE 16-DAY SUMMER SEMESTER.

ABSENCES REQUIRE CLEARANCE FROM ADMINISTRATION DUE TO THE TIGHT SCHEDULE WITH LIMITED FLEXIBILITY FOR ACCOMMODATING ADJUSTMENTS.

HOW DO I REGISTER?

WHAT DOES IT TAKE TO BE SUCCESSFUL IN SUMMER SCHOOL?

If you are motivated, organized, and can follow a timeline, you should successfully achieve your goal for summer school. Remember you have from the time of registration to July 21st (exams written by 23rd), to complete your course.

WHEN MAY I ATTEND?

June 30th to July 21: DL Courses (independent studies and test writing)
Monday to Thursday: 8:30 am - 3:00 pm
July 22- July 23: DL Courses (test writing only) Tuesday and Wednesday, 8:30 am-3:00 pm

HOW DO I REGISTER?

Call VPHS after April 14th to schedule an appointment with an administrator. Appointments will be scheduled starting May 1st during school hours.

If you are an out of Division student please bring a copy of your birth certificate with you.

*SS fees can be paid at the time of your intake meeting using debit or credit.

WHEN IS SUMMER SCHOOL?

Registrations are accepted between May 1 and June 6, 2025 for academic courses, and extended to June 20, 2025 for option courses. You may begin your course upon registration. All coursework must be completed by Monday July 21. July 22 and 23 are test writing days only. Marks will be submitted to Alberta Education on July 24, 2024.

CAN I TAKE MORE THAN ONE CLASS?

Usually you can take **one** core class in the summer session however, an appropriate course load and schedule will be developed at the intake meeting.

WHAT IS THE METHOD OF INSTRUCTION?

All courses are completed with hard copy materials and with in-person teacher support as needed and/or through an online communication tool like Teams, email, or phone.

*Diploma courses are offered in a classroom setting for Summer School. Information is provided in the Summer Diploma brochure.

WHAT HAPPENS IF I DO NOT FINISH MY COURSE BY JULY 23RD?

The intention is all Summer School courses be completed in the timeframe provided upon intake. A final mark will be submitted on July 25th for all Summer School courses whether passed or a failed. In the case you do not pass or complete your course and wish to complete it the following semester as a credit recovery or redo, please make an appointment to meet with an administrator at VPHS in the fall semester to make these arrangements. Remember, if you need the course as a prerequisite for a course you'll be starting in September, you must have finished the course this summer.
